

OUTPATIENT GP REFERRAL GUIDELINES ALLERGY/CLINICAL IMMUNOLOGY SERVICE Southern Adelaide Local Health Network (SALHN)

Atopic Eczema (Atopic Dermatitis)

Eczema is a chronic, pruritic skin condition which is commonly associated with elevated IgE antibodies. If eczema presents in infancy it may be a marker for the presence of food allergy (refer to <u>food allergy</u> <u>guidelines</u>)

Major features include:

- Pruritus
- Rash location and extent of disease varies according to age and trigger.
- A personal or family history of atopy or allergic disease

Information Required

- Outline of trial of SALHN Eczema Action Plan
- Response to use of frequent emollients and topical corticosteroids list names of trialled/current topical medications
- Medical History (Including any other allergies such as allergic rhinitis, asthma and or suspected or confirmed food allergies)
- Duration and severity of symptoms
- Effects on day to day living, including any failure to thrive issues.
- In infants list current diet/formula, weight and height and any gastrointestinal symptoms.

Investigations Required

No prior investigations indicated

Fax referrals to Allergy/Clinical Immunology Service

*Patient MUST have trialled medical management before referral to specialist care (excludes infants)

Red Flags

Red flags should prompt immediate GP referral to **Emergency Department**

Severe failure to thrive

Severe and/or infected eczema

Suggested GP Management

- Utilise moisturizers, corticosteroids applied frequently as per ASCIA Action Plan for Eczema in conjunction with avoidance of soap products.
- GP follow-up to assess skin for response to treatments applied.
- Book patient/carer into SALHN <u>Eczema</u>
